

How long have our judges been judging for?




Conclusion: From this graph we can infer that the great majority of the NZ Synchronised Swimming Judges continue for less than five years.


Conclusion: Most judges have done some training at Club level. We have barely 50% who have attended FINA judge clinics or schools. However we have 30% who have attended overseas non-FINA judge training. .

<u>Conclusion:</u> Online training is not very popular – face to face clinics, schools, workshops are well attended. At club training alongside coaches is working well.

SSNZ Judge Development Framework - Structure

The framework should provide horizontal and vertical development opportunities for new and existing Judges from the NZ Synchro community.

Growing Judging Community

1. SSNZ Intro to Synchro Swimming Judging Course

<u>Purpose</u>: To provide anyone interested in judging with an introduction to the knowledge, skills and understanding of safe and ethical principles for effective judging practices in synchronised swimming.

Format: Theory sessions

<u>Who should participate</u>? Ideal for anyone new to synchro or judging who are thinking of becoming a judge with SSNZ, and any other judge level who wishes to contribute. Participants include parents, and Synchro swimmers.

<u>Duration and delivery</u>: 2 - 3 hour course delivered by SSNZ to clubs. **10 June 2017 – at North Island comp – early morning start, 17 June 2017 – at South Island comp – early morning start.**

Key contents covered:

Fundamental judging information, ethics, protocols, where to find information, synchro skills
including: basic positions, basic sculling and propulsion techniques, basic figures and routine
skills.

Pre-requisites: No previous synchro or judging experience required.

Accreditation: To be discussed.

Resources:

- Intro to Synchro Judges manual / FINA Book / Rules
- Basic Synchro skills

Costs: To be discussed and defined

<u>Timing:</u> This course will be ideally offered at least once a year at each club/region – usually with North and South Islands.

2. Growing Judges

- Targeted at youth Judges(16+ years old) and parents / supporters
- Generic judging content delivered existing senior judges.
- Sport Specific component delivered/supported by SSNZ or identified Regional Judges.

The programme consists of:

- 1. Weekend Workshop (2 days) for Judges (one in each island) during end 2017 combined with FINA coach Clinic specifically new FINA figures and technical elements.
- 2. Self education using content and resources on the SSNZ website, SSNZ Facebook page and FINA website.

SSNZ Role – SSNZ will need clubs to help promote this programme across their Judges and potential future Judges and will liaise with the clubs to organise synchro-specific judge development and judging opportunities . SSNZ Role – SSNZ will develop the course's content and resources (by end 2017) and will ensure at least one course is delivered in each Island from 2018 onwards.

3. SSNZ Intermediate Synchro Judging Course

<u>Purpose</u>: To provide the knowledge and skills to Judge at national and international competitions.

Format: Theory and practical sessions. This course will consist of 4 modules:

- 1. Judging figures
- 2. Judging Routines execution, artistic impression, difficulty
- 3. Judging technical elements
- 4. Ethics and protocols
- 5. Pathway / opportunities

<u>Who should participate</u>? Judges wanting to judge at National and international competitions, and/or willing to deepen their judging skills and knowledge.

Duration and delivery: Each workshop will be at least one day depending on course content.

Pathways - SSNZ and FINA

Pre-requisites: Judges would be expected to have the FINA Judges Manual and the FINA Rules. .

Accreditation: To be discussed. Suggest: Shadow Judge

Costs: To be discussed and defined

<u>Timing:</u> Ideally each module will be offered at least once a year, aiming to alternate islands.

SSNZ Role – SSNZ will develop the modules' contents and resources during 2017 and offer the modules from the beginning of 2018. **End of 2017 there will be a judges clinic along these lines held with coaches clinic**.

4. FINA Synchro Judging Clinic/School

<u>Purpose</u>: To provide the knowledge and skills to Judge at national and high level international competitions and aim for registration on the FINA List.

Format: FINA Presenter

<u>Who should participate</u>? Judges wanting to judge at international competitions, and/or willing to deepen their judging skills and knowledge, perhaps with the aim of registration on the FINA List.

Duration and delivery: 1-3 days.

<u>Pre-requisites</u>: Judges would be expected to have completed Intermediate Course and have judging experience.

Resources:

- FINA Judges Manual
- E-learning resources (videos, etc)

Costs: To be discussed and defined

<u>Timing:</u> As per FINA guidelines – SSNZ will bid for and offer the schools/clinics where possible..

SSNZ Role – SSNZ will bid for a FINA Judging School to be held in 2018.

Judging Community

1. Basic / Intermediate / Advanced Judge Programmes

<u>Purpose</u>: To provide support to performance Judges in their personal and professional development.

<u>Format</u>: Club based, Island Based, National Based delivery of clinics from existing SSNZ judges, regular FINA clinics, possible support to attend overseas FINA training.

<u>Who should participate</u>? Judges need to be nominated by the clubs for these programmes. Synchro New Zealand will offer this opportunity to the Judges', aiming to have one Judge nominated per year.

SSNZ Role – SSNZ will identify potential Judges and will nominate them for possible financial assistance. When possible, and budget dependent, SSNZ will contribute towards any fee.

2. FINA Development Judging Clinics

Ensure that during the FINA Judging Clinics, time and resource is put aside for the Judges to have one-on-one time with high-profile international Judges.

Across all Judging Communities

1. Regional "Generic Judging" development opportunities

- Develop and strengthen relationships with SSNZ to provide the Basic Synchro Judges community access to national generic development opportunities.
- Develop a contact list for all Judges with club and judges contact details

2. SSNZ Judges Facebook Page

Maintain a Facebook Page for Judges to share learning resources, ideas and support

3. Bi-annual SSNZ Judges Convention

Aim to establish a bi-annual SSNZ Judges learning and development convention.

4. FINA Development Judging Clinics

Explore opportunities to host FINA Judges Clinics on a regular basis.

5. Mentoring opportunities

Identify key leaders in the judging community that would be keen and prepared to offer mentoring to other Judges'. Design a mentoring programme and provide training to the mentors.
