

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Nationals 2023 Theme

Teamwork - Resilience - Respect - Passion

This year with the introduction of the World Aquatics new Elements, Figures, Coaches' Cards and Scoring system, we felt that the Artistic Swimming NZ values set the pathway forward for this year's Nationals. We know from speaking to other countries that rolling out this new system has had its challenges.

So, as we journey together we will build on the strengths of:

* **Teamwork** - in working together and supporting each other as we learn the new systems, and athletes demonstrating great team spirit in and out of the water

* **Resilience** - learning new aspects in any field has trials and tribulations and as we progress we will continue to improve and develop our wonderful sport

- * **Respect** being inclusive, building on friendships and respecting all
- * **Passion** celebrating our sport and all the successes big and small!

The 2023 Nationals logo designed by Natasha Cuisel (previously involved with synchro in Queenstown), models the strength of our values, and is inspired by the colours of our Host Club Auckland Mermaids. Special thanks to Natasha (and her daughter Paige) who shared in the design of this one.



Draft Programme Schedule

Outlined below is a tentative Nationals schedule. The final schedule will be communicated after we have received preliminary entries - hopefully by the end of June.

Programme Considerations will Include:

- Teams will need to arrive in Auckland on the Friday for music practise preferably arriving before lunchtime to give us maximum flexibility
- Music practice will be held over Friday and Saturday morning
- Timings of competition events will need to allow additional time for scoring to be completed including Technical Controllers review of videos if required; Artistic and Execution judges to both manually record entries (there are more in the new system than previously). Typically we allow just over 2 minutes between routines for this to happen when we announce scores. Based on international feedback we will be allowing just over 4 minutes for this to happen and scores will not be read out (there are simply too many of them!).
- As we did at last year's Nationals, Intermediate and Secondary School competitions will not be run separately. Routine only scores from competition events will be used to manage this. NB: Athletes wanting to be entered for Intermediate and Secondary School events will need to note this on the entry forms, and there will be an additional charge for these entries.
- Prizegiving will be held at the pool daily assuming there are no dramas with the Scoring System. This is where we may need some flexibility!
- Teams should arrange to fly out as late as possible. International experience indicates that the first time competitions are run under the new rules, they are often run over time.

June 2023 Call for Judges	 Clubs will be asked to provide the names and contact details of the Judges they will be bringing to Nationals. Judges' Requirements: Each NZ Club entering swimmers at the National Championships must send one judge for each 6 swimmers entered in the competition. Technical Controllers and Referees who are appointed to the Meet, will be included in the 16 ratio for the Club from which they are affliated, unless ASNZ or the Meet funds all their costs for the competition. If you have 7 swimmers, you would be required to provide 2 judges and so on. Judges must be fully available to judge at the whole event, including all judges education forums, judges feedback sessions etc. Or a club can provide two judges if they wish to share their allocations across the event (but this will be counted for 1 judge in total for the Club's judge commitment). Coaches cannot be one of the allocated judges unless prior approval has been granted by ASNZ (for example, we understand that newly established clubs may have difficulty in growing sufficient judges). However, coaches may be included in Figures judging panels if they are not judging their own club athletes. Judges must be 18 years of age at the commencement of the competition. Clubs are expected to train and develop their own judges to meet this requirement. ASNZ runs judge education programmes to help with this. Please note, if a club is unable to meet this requirement, they should contact Simon Hardy at judging@artisticswimmingnz.org.nz and he can connect you. ASNZ has a pool of judges/Technical Controllers affliated to Te Pangu who can be tapped into. Clubs will need to meet those judge's costs to attend. NB: Clubs participating for the first time are exempt from this requirement in their first year of competition. If you have more Judges than your ratio who wish to come, please include their names too, as other Clubs who don't have enough Judges may choose to fund them

You will need to redo the Coach Card using the ISS programme Upload the new card to the Dropbox and make sure you add to the name of the Coach Card the words UPDATEDthen event, name of athlete (e.g. UPDATED_Free 12U Solo_Mary Smith) Once you have uploaded the new Coach Card please email Lead Technical Controller and our Chief Recorder Vicki Hustler and Assistant Scorer Kate Boyt kate.evan@xtra.co.nz. They will remove the old card from the dropbox and keep the card that has UPDATED on it.
	 No changes to the Coach Card can be made after the 9 September 2023 unless on medical grounds. If this is the case the following steps will be taken: A request in writing is made to the Meet Referee and Lead Technical Controller up to 24 hours prior to the athlete's event. The request for change to the Coach Card must be accompanied by a medical certificate for the person who is sick / injured and cannot perform the programme set with the coach card. The Meet Referee and Lead Technical Controller will consider the request for a change to the card and will get back to the coach within 12 hours from the swimmers / team event. And will work with the coach on the process to update the Coach Card if approved.
	PLEASE NOTE as this will be our second time using the new scoring system. There will be hiccups, as we are all learning this new process together (<i>just in time learning</i>) and things may not be right the first few times. Our focus will be doing the best we can for the athletes. PATIENCE AND UNDERSTANDING IS THE KEY.

Entry fees are applicable to all swimmers, including any reserves named for Solo, Duet, Team and Combination / Acrobatic events.



Pool Information


The competition will take place in the divewell at West Wave Pool & Leisure Centre, Henderson. The dive pool measures 15m x 20m

Swimmers will enter the water at the 15m wide edge and judges will sit on either side of the 20m long length of the pool.

Start deck (small step up) offset, not compulsory to use – see map start area. All routines will begin on the start area as per the attached map. At the completion of the routine swimmers will return to the start deck end of the pool after completion of their



routine. During competition, a clear deck policy will apply and only those with official accreditation will be allowed on the pool deck.
